


# Keeping Safe Week

# Class 1 Home Learning Week beg 15/06/2020

For your home learning this week, please choose at least one activity from each area of safety.

 <p><b>Coronavirus</b></p>	 <p><b>Sun Safety</b></p>
<p><b>Activity 1</b> - watch 'While we Can't Hug', the story of Hedgehog and Tortoise socially distancing: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2PnnFrPaRgY">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2PnnFrPaRgY</a>          Grown ups – please talk to the children about social distancing. Then draw a picture of yourself and a friend or relative doing something to show that you love each other, like Hedgehog and Tortoise did. It may be waving, dancing, making funny faces, painting, whatever you choose to show that you care.</p> <p><b>Activity 2</b> – write a letter to a friend or relative who you haven't seen for a while, like Hedgehog and Tortoise did. I have attached a template to this blog, and you can use your sound mat to sound out to spell.</p> <p><b>Activity 3</b> – watch the attached power point – 'This is the Way we Wash our Hands' song. It is very important to wash our hands properly to keep them clean. Learn the song with a grown up to remind you how to wash your hands. You may choose to change the words or you could make up your own song using the tune of a nursery rhyme which you already know.</p>	<p><b>Activity 1</b> - Watch the first half of 'Sammy Seagulls Summer Safety Story' on the attached power point with a grown up. Learn the song and add actions to help you remember the sun safety rules. Stop when you get to the second verse.</p> <p><b>Activity 2</b> – Pack for sun safety using the cutting and sticking sheet attached. Which items do you need to keep you safe in the sun? Which ones do you not need? Why/Why not? You may choose to use a real bag and real items to pack for sun safety.</p> <p><b>Activity 3</b> – Design a sunhat. Use the design sheet to choose and create a sun hat. What colour will it be? Will it have a pattern on it? Maybe a picture? What will it be made of? Draw and colour your ideas onto the template and then sound out to write labels to show what your hat will be like.</p>
 <p><b>Beach Safety</b></p>	 <p><b>Internet Safety</b></p>
<p><b>Activity 1</b> - Watch the second half of 'Sammy Seagulls Summer Safety Story' on the attached power point with a grown up. Learn the second verse of the song and add actions to help you remember the beach safety rules. Then sing the whole song for sun and beach safety to an audience, adding your actions as you sing. Ask a grown up to record you doing so and send to Mrs Wakeham.</p> <p><b>Activity 2</b> – make a beach safety poster, to tell people how to stay safe at the beach. Choose one of the attached templates for your poster.</p> <p><b>Activity 3</b> – Play the sun, sea and beach safety game using the attached game and cards. Use the safe and protect cards to help you remember the sun and beach safety rules that we have been learning about this week.
