

The aim of this lesson is to read different examples of Greek myths and to explore the different features that make up a Greek myth.

I have used Theseus and the Minotaur as an example underneath, including some of the features that you will be looking for when reading through your own Greek myths. **Features: hero, monster, setting, journey, problem and solution.**

Hero

Theseus could be seen as a hero for killing the minotaur and saving the people of Athens.



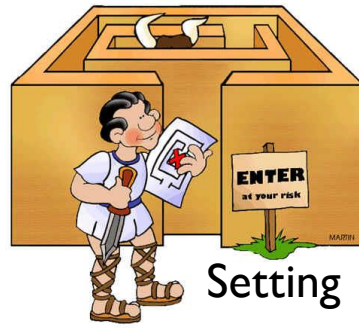
Monster

The minotaur could be seen as a villain for eating the children of Crete.



Problem

King Minos was taking children from Athens and feeding them to the minotaur.



Setting

The Labyrinth. Athens. Crete.



Journey

Theseus travels to Crete from Athens and then back again.



Resolution

Theseus kills the minotaur with the help of Ariadne and a golden ball of thread.
