English:

We are going to continue our learning about Theseus and the Minotaur today. Last week, we focused on developing vocabulary to describe the characters before writing a character description and today we are going to be generating vocabulary to describe the setting.

Reading:

Reading comprehension- The Story of Arachne- read the text and then write down the answers to the questions in full sentences. Remember you need to include the question within the answer (we have practised this in school!) You will see the level of challenge is from 1* to 3*, choose the level of your choice but remember to challenge and stretch yourself. The questions are within the same document as are the answers so that you can **self-mark your work once completed.**
