## English:

#### Reading:

Yesterday in our TEAMS session we read Chapter 1 of Charlotte's Web together and answered some questions about the text. Your task today is linked to vocabulary and retrieval. You need to read chapter 1 or listen to it being read by following this link:

### **Spelling/Phonics:**

#### **Computing:**

Your task today is to create your own Greek mosaic using a design program. A mosaic is a piece of art made up of small, coloured pieces. These pieces can be coloured glass, stone, paper or other materials. The small pieces are combined to make one large picture or pattern.

The Ancient Greeks and the Romans created mosaic art and some of them can still be seen today. They used mosaics to decorate the floors and walls of their houses. Have you seen these before? Maybe you have seen some when you have been on holiday or maybe you have seen them in a film or on the internet. There are some examples of these mosaics in the uploads.

Our TEAMS session today is going to begin by showing you how to copy and paste a web address from a document into the web browser. Once we have arrived at the correct web page you are going to learn how you can create a Greek mosaic design using the following website:
