#### **English:**

Your task for today is to reflect on and evaluate your Greek myth.

Open the document in the uploads called 'English Friday Evaluation'. You will see there is a table in the document. You will need to read each statement and see if you have included it in your myth. You will then need to find evidence of it within your myth and record it in the table. \*\*Send me your table once you have completed it via TEAMS chat. \*\* The end column says 'teacher'- I will fill this column in once I have received your myth and table.

The final task to complete is at the bottom of the document where you have to write down something you are really proud of in your writing and something you will improve on in your next piece of writing. This will show that you have completed the writing cycle of *plan-write-edit and improve-evaluate*.

## **Reading:**

Reading comprehension- The story of Icarus- read the text and then write down the answers to the questions in full sentences. Remember you need to include the question within the answer (we have practised this in school!) You will see the level of challenge is from 1\* to 3\*, choose the level of your choice but remember to challenge and stretch yourself. The questions are within the same document as are the answers so that you can <u>self-mark your work once completed</u>.
